

Student iPad Expectations

Make sure you understand your responsibilities:

1. Bring your iPad to every class, every day. The iPad must be transported in the school-issued case.
2. Use of the iPad is subject to the school's policy on Acceptable Use of Technology Resources, Internet Safety and Cyber bullying.
3. The care of your District iPad is your responsibility. Do not lend your iPad to another person. Each iPad is assigned to an individual student and the responsibility for the care of the iPad solely rests with that student.
4. Do not alter or remove the District iPad management software or any pre-installed apps or tools.
5. Make sure that your iPad is fully charged every day when you come to school.
6. Your iPad is like your locker: it can be inspected at any time by a school administrator or designee. At that time you will be required to give the administrator or designee your lock code for your iPad.
7. Make sure you know what each teacher expects in his/her classroom.
8. You are responsible for any damage to your iPad. Immediately report a damaged or lost/stolen iPad to the front office.
9. Remember the school's policy on the transmission of inappropriate materials including pictures, videos, or text messages.
10. Protect your passwords (e-mail, I-Tunes, etc.). Do not share them with anyone.
11. All student handbook rules also apply to digital communication.
12. Checking personal email, social media (Facebook, Twitter, etc), texting, unpermitted online chatting, and/or "IM"ing from the iPads is **not** allowed.
13. The iPad is an electronic device and you must handle it carefully. Never throw or slide the iPad or a book bag that contains the iPad. Never place the iPad in a book bag that contains food, liquids or heavy/sharp objects. Avoid placing weight on the iPad. Do not shut the cover if anything is lying on the iPad screen.

You MUST:

1. Keep iPad free of writing, marks, stickers, or other attachments.
2. Keep the school's attached label on your iPad at all times.
3. Keep your iPad with you or in a secure location (locked locker) at all times.
Do not leave your iPad in a car, with a friend, or unattended.
4. Keep your iPad free of apps, photos, videos, or music that are not school appropriate.
5. Only visit school appropriate and/or approved sites.
Do not attempt to or intentionally "go around" the school's web filtering system.
Do not use any "hacking software" or attempt to gain access without permission.
6. Take your iPad home at the end of the day and fully charge it for the next school day.
7. Leave "push notifications" turned off unless otherwise directed by your teacher.
